Abstract Your 35-word abstract, which will appear in the conference program, should be an explicit summary of the paper that states the problem, the methods used, and the major results and conclusions. It should be complementary to rather than a repeat of the title.

Introduction

Sections should not be numbered unless absolutely necessary. There are several stylistic options pre-defined in this template for you to use. As long as you stay within the paper formatting guidelines you are welcome to supplement these options with those of your choice. The pre-defined options are discussed in the following sections.

Enumerations

Here are examples for lists:

- A bullet list including things like this,
- or this,
- or even this.

Of course, you can also use an enumeration instead

1. like this,
2. or this,
3. or even this.

Citing prior work

References appear in the text as superscripts like this¹ or this^{1,2} or this¹⁻³. This saves some space, which can come in handy on a 2-page paper. (Please note that in the current version of this template, your bibliography file must contain a `\vspace*{-3mm}` after each bibliographic entry. Otherwise your list of references will have overly large spacings between its entries.)

Figures

All fonts used within figures (axes labels, descriptions, etc.) must appear at least at 7pt in the final figure size and must be in high enough resolution to be easily readable when printed. The paper must be able to

print clearly on standard black-and-white printers. Most reviewers will not view your paper in colour, and the final version of all accepted papers will be published in black-and-white in the conference proceedings. Colour versions of your figures will only be available in the soft-copies of the proceedings.

You may use either single-column figures like Fig. 1, which is handled as a regular float by L^AT_EX, or double-column figures like Fig. 2, which unfortunately have to still be manually placed in this version of the L^AT_EX-template. (Any suggestions from L^AT_EX-experts on how to improve this issue are always welcome.) We recommend placement on either the top or the bottom of a page. In any case, the figure caption should appear beneath the figure in 8pt font.

Tables

Like figures, tables can be single-column, such as Tab. 1 or double-column, such as Tab. 2 (unfortunately, with all the complications of a double-column environment as of yet.) You are free to format the tables to best fit your needs.
